# Public Hearing on the December 7<sup>th</sup> Special Town Meeting warrant articles

After calling the meeting to order, Mr. Coen opened the Public Hearing and read the notice into the record as follows:

"In accordance with §5-2-1of the Provincetown General By-Laws, the Provincetown Finance Committee will hold a **Public Hearing on Monday, November 23, 2009 at 3:30 pm** at the Provincetown Center for Coastal Studies, Larkin Hall, 5 Holway Avenue, Provincetown, MA to hear comments from the public on the December 7<sup>th</sup> Special Town Meeting Warrant Articles. Copies of the Special Town Meeting Warrant Articles are available for inspection in the office of Town Manager/Board of Selectmen, Town Hall, 16 Jerome Smith Road, Provincetown, MA.

Comments may be submitted in writing to that office no later than Thursday, November 19, 2009, or in person at the hearing."

Mr. Coen noted that no written statements had been received.

### Home Rule Petition/Exempting New Police Department Members from Civil Service – Presented by Jeff Jaran

Mr. Coen made some briefly outlined the purpose of the civil service, and noted that the police forces in only four other towns on the Cape & Islands operate under civil service rules.

Chief Jaran noted that the Article would exempt only new recruits from the civil service. Existing employees would not lose their civil service standing. The current civil service hiring process handicaps Provincetown relative to other towns on the Cape. The Chief emphasized that there are ethical and professional ways to run the hiring process in such a way as to protect our officers without civil service. He is discussing with the union how to put in place an agreed upon set of processes.

Meeting Date: November 23, 2009

Due to tough economic times, many towns throughout the Commonwealth have laid off police officers. The certified list of potential hires is loaded with these officers from the larger cities off cape. A position must be offered to those officers first. Most of them do not have any real interest or long-term commitment to coming here. This results in high turnover. Essentially we've become a training ground for police officers. Chronic understaffing results in high overtime for the remaining officers.

Professional hiring practice would be put in place including exams, established by other chiefs on the cape – written, physical, oral, and psychological plus background check. Provincetown would have access to the list of potential candidates on the Cape. We would interview only those that are the most qualified, versus the time consuming Civil Service process of working through the list. Truro has never had a hard time hiring officers that are a good fit with community and are committed to living there.

Noting that there were no members of the public present to speak, Mr. Coen closed the Public Hearing at approximately 3:55 pm.

Towards the end, Mr. Hoort stated that he didn't expect his local government to be a jobs creator.
