




BAS RELIEF AND BAS RELIEF PARK MASTER CONSERVATION PLAN



Bas Relief & Park Master Conservation Plan

***Presentation Dec. 1, 2016, 6 pm
Veterans Memorial Community Center***

In preparation for the 2020 Commemoration, the Town approved Community Preservation Funds for the preparation of a [Master Conservation Plan for the Bas Relief](#). The Bas Relief commemorates the signing of the Mayflower Compact on November 11, 1620 in Provincetown Harbor. The focal point is the restoration of the Bas Relief Bronze tablet, *Signing of the Mayflower Compact*, designed by Cyrus Dallin as the centerpiece for the Park in celebration of the tercentennial. RDLA led a team of consultants in the preparation of this Plan with a focus on the stabilization and repair of the Bas Relief and secondary monuments in the park. This presentation will walk us through the proposed improvements, options, budgets, and timeline. 2020 is just a couple of fiscal years away and ideally the work would be complete in advance for all the events leading up to 2020. In addition to the conservation of the Bas Relief and preservation of the other memorials, the plan allows for the addition of a memorial honoring the Wampanoag people; it addresses issues of public safety, accessibility, and overall site improvements such as plantings, signage, and furnishings.
