ATM Warrant Article Reviews

<u>ATM 17. Land Bank</u> – Acquisition of land for Community Agriculture, Conservation, Conservation, and Open Space – 6R, 10R and 14R, Browne Street

Presented by Dennis Minsky, Brian Carlson, & David Hale

At the first meeting concerning this article, the Committee voted to reserve recommendation. There were questions about the appraisal value of the parcels and about how the land was to be maintained and cared for in the way described by the proponents, specifically in terms of use for community gardens.

A new appraisal was presented to the Committee indicating that the land, if developed, could be worth as much as \$507,250. This is well above the amount asked for in the article. In addition, the proponents have a grant application already submitted that, if awarded, would bring the contribution from the Land Bank down to \$86,400.

Concerning maintenance, there are some funds available from the Land Bank itself. There are also plans to obtain other funds from the Barnstable County Land Management grant program and from Americorp.

<u>ATM Article 10, Section 2F</u> - \$800,000 of Community Housing reserves to fund a grant for 32 units of community housing at 35 Race Point Road, to be known as Stable Path.

Presented by: Ted Malone (Community Housing Resource)

The Committee had previously voted to NOT recommend this article.

A lengthy discussion ensued between Mr. Malone and members of the Committee regarding his proposed project. Among the concerns raised by the Committee were:

- Potential competition for renters with the Town's 90 Shankpainter Road development;
- Availability of sufficient water supplies from Truro wells;
- Eligibility of Town employees for median income units (most employees salaries exceed the county median);
- Eligibility of very low income individuals for affordable units (State guidelines limit rent to 30% of income); and
- Cash grant versus borrowing (a cash grant would deplete the CPA housing reserves by 2014).

Following the discussion, there was no motion to reconsider the Committee's previous vote. Therefore, the previous vote to NOT recommend stands.

STM Article 31 – Home Rule Petition – Real Estate Transfer Fee

Presented by: Barbara Rushmore (Petitioner)

The Committee had previously voted to NOT recommend this article due to concerns about the constitutionality of the exemption for long term residents.

Lengthy discussion ensued between Ms. Rushmore and the members of the Committee regarding the article. In addition to the constitutionality issue, the Committee raised other concerns:

- An additional 1% local transfer fee would nearly triple the total transfer fee from \$5.46 per \$1,000 to \$15.46 per \$1,000;
- As written, it would be very difficult to get passed by the legislature;
- In Nantucket the buyer pays the fee, not the seller;
- Also in Nantucket, first time buyers are exempt from the fee if they reside in the home for at least five years.

Following the discussion, Ms. Rushmore agreed to consider the issues raised by the Committee. The Committee offered to assist in reshaping the article for a future Town Meeting.
